From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

We invite you to join with us and bring a friend or family member with you this Sunday morning as we celebrate Easter and Christ's resurrection from the dead with our Sunrise Communion Service at 7:00 AM and our Contemporary Easter Festival Service at 10:45 AM in the Family Life Center. It is because of Easter that our new life in Christ will never be the same again as we share His love with the world.

Speaking of sharing His love with the world, we were blessed during the weekend of April 1-3, to have the Transforming Churches Network (TCN) consultation team on site evaluating the effectiveness of our ministry in reaching the lost. On April 3, in a special congregational meeting, the consultation team made their official report of five areas of strength, five areas of concern, and five prescriptions for implementation they believe will improve our effectiveness in being an outreach focused ministry in our community.

Our next step in the process is for us to host three Town Hall Meetings (April 17 at 2:30pm, April 27 at 6:30pm without staff members, and May 9 at

6:30pm) to solicit your input, discussion, and questions that you might have about the implications of the report for our ministry. Then, on Sunday, May 15 at 1:30pm, a special congregational meeting will be held to determine whether or not it is God's will in leading us to approve by a 2/3 vote the report in its entirety (no line item vetoes) for implementation over the next two years as an outreach focused church.

You will find the report listed below for your study. It is my hope that you will give it your prayerful study, attend one or more of the Town Hall Meetings, and join with us on May 15 at 1:30 PM!

GLC Ministries). Everyone has been helpful and provided us with all the information that was required for us to conduct this consultation. Our prayer is that God will use this report to motivate the congregation to do great things for God in this community.

Strengths

Accepting Church & School Family: The people of Grace Lutheran Church and School exude a warm, friendly atmosphere that demonstrates Christian love for each other, as well as guests and visitors attending worship and other activities in both the church and school.

School: Grace Lutheran School teaches the whole child with excellence. The school is blessed with loving and caring teachers and staff who not only work to meet the student's academic needs but also help them mature into "little Christs" who serve their Lord and others.

Location: While there are some obvious drawbacks to being landlocked and fighting one-way traffic patterns, we believe Grace's location is a strength. Grace is situated in a well traveled, easily accessible area of town. Grace is in close proximity to major upscale shopping, a major travel artery and an economically stable area. The main marquee is visible by many thousands of prospects daily.

Biblical Values and Teaching: GLC Ministries' identity is based on sound, doctrinally correct values built on a foundation of a wide variety of Scripturally based teaching for all ages, with a particular strength in Youth and Adult studies.

Potential: GLC Ministries is poised to become an even greater blessing to the Huntsville community, because pastor, staff, and lay

leaders express a genuine willingness to do what it takes to reach those outside of the faith. In addition, there is an abundance of available space that can be used for ministry to those who are not yet part of the Grace family.

Concerns

Lack of a Shared Outward Focused Vision & Plan: "Where there is no vision, the people perish." Proverbs 29:18. GLC Ministries, over the years, has lost a clear vision of its mission and ministry. The frustration of staff, members and leaders is evident in their concern for decreasing worship attendance and school enrollment, as well as a difficulty in recruiting volunteers. Without a shared, God-given vision, GLC Ministries will continue to decline, have a decreasing Gospel impact on its community, and experience conflict between personalities, groups, and teams.

Focused Outreach: Though there are several well established service initiatives, such as "Be The Church" and ministry to the Hispanic community, GLC Ministries lack a well focused outreach strategy in cadence with the Great Commission. Service projects are done well, but stop short of actually making disciples.

Accountability: The present structure of GLC Ministries separates responsibility from authority and does not provide an effective process for review, evaluation, and accountability in order to achieve excellence in mission and ministry. There have been and continue to be many good plans and ministries at Grace, but the lack of accountability has often resulted in poor follow-through and/or a duplication of efforts. (Hebrews 13:17)

Financial Stewardship and Accountability: While

Where has the school year gone? We are nearing the end of a very successful school year. Thanks in large part to all of you who have so faithfully supported the educational ministry of Grace with your time, talents and treasures. Also, it is good to mention the talented faculty and staff working together so that the ministry of Christ may be glorified and lifted up. It is through such gifted people by God that our Lord blesses our efforts and the product is blessed threefold. To Him alone belongs all glory and honor! 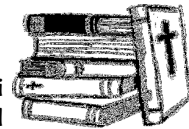

many in the congregation are concerned with the building debt, the greater concern is the apparent lack of accurate, timely reporting and accountability including checks and balances within the financial system. There is an apparent disconnect due to the reporting of budget shortfalls rather than actual receipts versus actual expenses. Also, there is no ongoing stewardship education.

Campus Appearance: Research indicates that the first two minutes on a ministry campus will determine whether a person considers returning or not. While the Grace campus is vast, visible and functional, the appearance and upkeep leaves much to be desired. Evidence of a need for more attention to an attractive appearance includes landscaping, peeling paint, roof leaks and outdated decor.

Prescriptions

Shared Vision: Under the leadership of the Southern District, GLC Ministries will engage in a comprehensive Visioning process, which will include, but not be limited to, interviews and focus groups with people and leaders in the community, prayer walking in targeted areas, and an interpretation of the area demographics. An outward focused Vision Statement will be written by September 15 and adopted by the congregation no later than November 30, 2011.

Upon adoption of the Vision Statement, the worship services and other ministries, will be aligned with the established mission targets and strategies, by June 30, 2012.

Focused Outreach: Within the next 12 months, the Senior Pastor will coordinate with the staff in leading GLC Ministries to:

- Conduct a minimum of 6 net-fishing events. These could include current service initiatives (“Be

the Church”, Hispanic outreach, School projects, etc.), but must also include relationship building and intentional gospel sharing elements.

- Set annual numeric goals and be held accountable for:
 - Non-infant baptisms through church and school ministries;
 - Non-members served through the various outreach activities; and
 - Increasing member involvement in outreach activities
- Equip the school and congregation (children, youth, and adults) in sharing their faith journey and creating “God Space” in their relationships for the Holy Spirit to work in and through them. 1 Peter 3:15
- Begin at least 10 interest groups with trained leaders with the purpose of forming relationships and living out the gospel among unchurched friends and neighbors with the ultimate goal of sharing the good news of Jesus Christ. Five new interest groups are to begin by September 15, 2011. At least one interest group will target Youth and another will target Young Adults.
- Increase the unbeliever/unchurched traffic on the campus.

Accountability: Ministry goals, which shall include the goals of all staff, shall be submitted to the Church Council by the Senior Pastor by July 1, 2011. These goals will include, but not be limited to, the number of new disciples, multiplication of leaders, and growth of specific ministries. Training in the Accountable Leader Model of governance will be conducted by a representative from the Southern District by March 31, 2012. The Council will be responsible for writing the Guiding Principles for this governance model by January 31, 2012. Appropriate constitution and bylaw changes will be written by the Church Council or their

assigned task force between January 1 and March 31, 2012 and voted upon by the congregation no later than the June, 2012 Voters' Meeting. Consequences and benefits for meeting or not meeting goals will be determined and enforced by the Church Council (Board of Directors when the new governance structure is adopted) and will begin with the new Board in 2012-13.

Financial Stewardship & Accountability: By September 30, 2011, the Church Council President, in collaboration with the Senior Pastor, Principal, Business Manager and Treasurer, shall:

- Develop a policy statement addressing monthly reporting to the Church Council (BOD), Principal and Senior Pastor, on a timely basis (within five business days of new month) a detailed line item report of all funds/accounts for both school and congregation. This report will include both monthly and year to date data for actual income and expenses, a comparison of the budget vs. actual, and any payments on hold;
- Develop a summary report format for release to the congregation demonstrating monthly and year to date actual income and expenses as well as percent of budget;
- Require the Senior Pastor to have a working knowledge of the affairs of the business office;
Explore other policies they deem necessary.

Within six months, the Senior Pastor will develop and implement a sustainable plan for ongoing stewardship education through multiple means including but not limited to designated Sundays, preaching, publications and Bible studies.

Campus Appearance: The Senior Pastor will assemble a First Impressions team by June 30, 2011. This team will meet to assess the needs concerning the physical property and landscape of the GLC campus. This team will also consult with the school Principal so that the needs of the school facilities are met. Areas of concern not requiring special funding should be completed before the beginning of the next school year (August 2011).

Special attention needs to be given to the following:

- Exterior church signs
- Peeling paint
- Flower beds
- Roof leaks
- Interior directional signage for the church
- Paint and décor in hallways and bathrooms
- Renovation of Old Gym to meet ministry needs
- Refurbish pews in the sanctuary
- Sanitize restrooms.

Funding needs and priorities are to be presented to the voters for approval by June of 2012.

The congregation will vote on accepting or rejecting this report by May 15, 2011. If the report is accepted, the Southern District commits to provide a Transformation Coach and to "walk along side" GLC Ministries for a minimum of two years to help with the implementation of this report. The cost for the coach is borne by the congregation.

Conclusion: We want to thank you for the opportunity to consult with you. We believe your best days as a congregation are ahead of you.

Puzzle Brooch

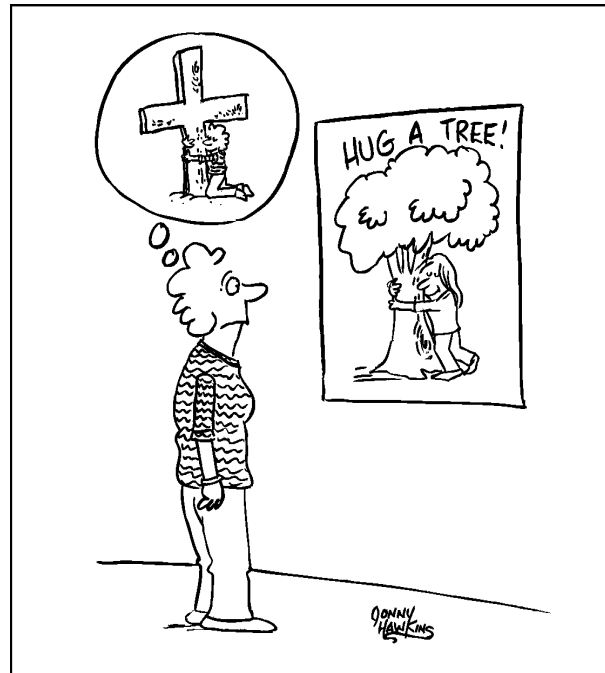
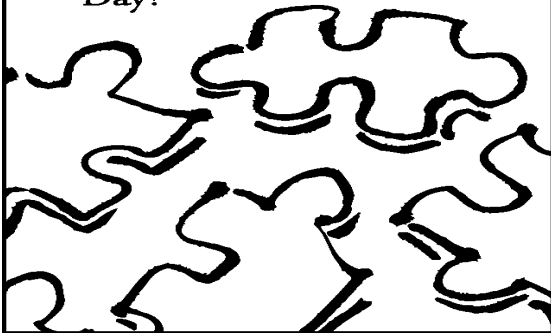
Make this keepsake to let your mom, grandma or aunt know that you wouldn't be complete without her!

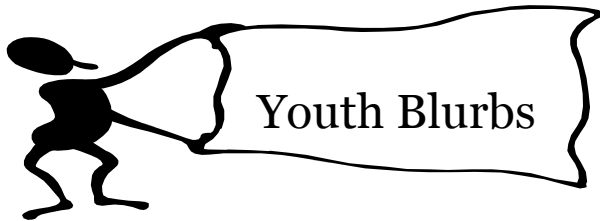
What you need:
