Waiting for Too Long

I knew that it was going to happen, I worried about the damage it would certainly cause, but I waited too long to take the right action. About two years ago when a spring storm blew, when the trees were newly heavy with leaves, one of the large limbs on our neighbor's tree splintered and slowly leaned over and rested on the roof of their home. It was loud, it was scary, it was a large limb that fell; but the remaining limbs cushioned its fall, preventing any significant damage to the home. No one was injured, the limb just had to be removed.

It is my suspicion, that in that event, another large limb sustained a life ending injury. It essentially died that day, but it did not fall. Ever since that time, that particular limb has not budded out in the spring, there's been no new growth, and then it started rot. You could see it. The woodpeckers were having a hay day. Boring insects ate away at its structural integrity. It was obvious that it would come down.

The doomed limb angled precariously over our driveway. It was clear which way gravity would take it when the inevitable happened. I took note and quit parking the camper underneath it. I warned guests not to park their cars underneath it. I told the kids not to play underneath it. I tried on a couple of occasions to get the home owner's phone number from the renters, but my attempts to get the phone number were not persistent enough. I could tell what was going to happen for probably a year and a half before it took place. But decay is slow, it happens little by little, and you always think, "If it has hung on for this long...it will hang on a little longer."

On my birthday, I had a very good birthday present. I went out early in the morning to run with our dog, and there was the limb. Sprawled out across our driveway and shattered into pieces. My heart leapt for joy at my good fortune. The only damage it did was to pull the power line from my neighbor's home. It could have sparked a fire, but it didn't. It could have fallen on a vehicle, but it didn't. It could have fallen on a person, but it didn't. How fortunate I was that it did not cause any more problems than what it did, because if something worse would have happened, the guilt truly would have been heavy to carry—knowing that it could have been prevented with a little proactivity.



God often provides us with spiritual lessons in the regular occurrences of day-to-day life. Just standing by and procrastinating until the limb fell, is a healthy reminder not to do that in spiritual matters. Sometimes we live our lives of faith thinking, "Well if that limb has not fallen yet...I still have a little longer, it can wait." And when we do, we avoid sharing the Gospel with someone. We avoid confessing a sin that we've committed against someone. We avoid confronting someone over a sin they've committed against us. We avoid pursuing a good work that God has placed on our hearts because we always think there will be a little more time. We avoid taking the next step in our discipleship of Jesus, because with think there will be more time.

God has prepared good works in advance for us to walk in them...not delay them. The prophet Hosea spoke, "Sow righteousness for yourselves, reap the fruit of unfailing love, and break up your unplowed ground; for it is time to seek the LORD, until he comes and showers his righteousness on you." (Hosea 10:12) It is always the right time to seek the Lord and pursue the plans that He has for your life.

WORSHIP | GROW | ENGAGE is our

discipleship focus. Disciple-making is a process that needs ongoing attention. Jesus commands us to make disciples. We are EACH to be disciple-makers. What priority are you giving to being a disciple? Do not leave it

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to the church/school staff to do the discipling! Are you keeping your eyes and ears open to opportunities to build connections with someone and be ready to share your faith story? I find joy when I hear or see how persons become involved in sharing Jesus with others.

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Through a friend, Greg Finke, I share with you reasons why so many congregations make a good start with missional living, only to see it soon fizzle. How are you doing with developing a missional plan for yourself or for your family? Do you invite others to join in the missional plan?

1) We think studying what Jesus says is the same as doing what Jesus says.

2) We never seem to get around to building an actual friendship with someone who is living without Jesus' grace and truth.

3) People are often recruited away from the mission of God by their own congregational programming as we can be so busy taking care of ourselves.

4) We think discipleship is rooted in scholarship. It is not. It is rooted in relationship and lifestyle.

When discipleship is rooted in scholarship, we often reproduce nothing but scholars and do it very slowly. Likewise, the unintentional but clear message to the congregation is that discipleship is really just for the smart kids. Unfortunately, when discipleship is simply scholarship, we end up with people who know the right answers, but don't know what to do. They remain untrained and inexperienced in practicing the ways of Jesus for the good of others.

However, discipleship is not just learning the facts and figures of the faith. It is having a relationship with someone who can show us how to live out the facts and figures of the faith for the good of others. When discipleship is rooted in relationship and lifestyle, we see the rapid multiplication of discipleship among people (John 13:35, Philippians 3:17, Hebrews 13:7, Matthew 28:19).

Because preachers and program leaders think discipleship is scholarship, they over-value teaching new content and under-value facilitating discipling relationships and lifestyles.

Remedy: Re-prioritize discipling relationships.

At home: the parent/child relationship is the strongest discipling relationship there is. Children are designed to imitate their parents and, for better or worse, are already being deeply discipled by them. Therefore, the most effective family ministry begins by helping parents understand the deep influence their lifestyle is already having on their children and give them tools to become more intentional about how they live.

In neighborhoods, workplaces and schools: implement the Connect Strategy in order to foster and multiply discipling relationships and unhurried conversations throughout the congregation and out into the community.
