# Grace Lutheran Selected to Participate in Set Apart to Serve Pilot Program

"Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent... So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." (Romans 10:13-17).

Grace Lutheran is currently experiencing a season of growth, health, and vitality. This is evidenced by increases in membership, worship attendance, school enrollment, participation in Sunday School and Adult Bible Studies, financial stability, and other markers. We are far from a perfect congregation. We certainly have challenges to work through, and sin does break into our congregation and our lives to do its damage. However, God is good, and Christ overcomes our sin, forgiving us and faithfully carrying out His work through imperfect instruments like us. Christ working in this place is the reason we are experiencing this season of growth, health, and vitality. And here are some of the things that He is using to accomplish His work:

- •Members who are passionate about seeing Jesus' church thrive and faithfully using their gifts to serve Him.
- •Congregational unity in mission, purpose, direction, and the supremacy of the Gospel that overcomes the devil's attempts to sow division.
- •Membership in a church body that is faithful to the Word of God and uses that Word of God as the primary source of doctrine and practice.


- •Location in a city that is ripe for a healthy, vibrant congregation. As many people relocate to Huntsville, this gives us many opportunities to share God's Word with people who are looking for a place to call home.
- •Consistent presence of faithful church workers who are motivated to serve the Kingdom of God. We are blessed with 1 Pastor, 2 DCEs, 1 Principal, and 7 teachers who have been taught and trained in Lutheran Higher Education Universities and Seminaries.

While we give thanks to Christ for our congregation's season of growth, health, and vitality, the LCMS and its universities and seminaries have identified a potential crisis on the horizon. Our universities and seminaries have seen a significant decrease in enrollment in church work programs in recent years. The chart below shows decreases in enrollment statistics from 2004-2018.

These decreases in enrollment paint a concerning picture. If churches are going to continue to thrive, we are either going to need to increase enrollment in these important church work programs or congregations are going to need to become creative in identifying and preparing lay people for service within their own congregations.

Another trend to consider is the age of our active enrolled pastors. This chart illustrates that 46% of our active ordained pastors will be at or above retirement age within the next 10 years. These realities not only have grabbed the attention of our Colleges, Universities, Seminaries, Synodical Leaders, and congregations, these realities have all of those institutions and ministries working together to find solutions.



One area of focus revolves around the identification, development, and encouragement of future church workers in their home congregations. This requires a group effort from parents, current church workers, and congregational leaders who are able to recognize both the potential, as well as the great need. Grace has been selected as one of 46 congregations in our synod to participate in a pilot program called Set Apart to Serve. In the year ahead I will be receiving training and materials from our synod intended to guide and support our congregation in seeking to identify, equip, and prepare the next generation of church workers. The harvest is plentiful and the workers are few, and I wonder if God is blessing us with health at this stage in our ministry so that we might be fertile ground for raising up and nurturing future church workers in our own midst. Watch for more information to come.







## PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

WORSHIP | GROW | ENGAGE is our discipleship focus. Disciple-making is a process that needs ongoing attention. Jesus commands us to make disciples. We are EACH to be disciple-makers. What priority are you giving to being a disciple? Do not leave it to the church/school staff to do the discipling!



Are you keeping your eyes and ears open to opportunities to build connections with someone and be ready to share your faith story? I find joy when I hear or see how persons become involved in sharing Jesus with others.

God blessed Grace Lutheran with a great Christmas celebration! More than 450 people attended our Christmas Eve worship services. Many of these were guests that were likely at Grace Lutheran for the first time. Worship services are to be reverent and we do not want to adversely affect anyone's worship. You are encouraged to take time to greet the people in the area where you are seated, and when you exit the church. It can appear that we are just moving "cars" through the worship service. We do not have much time for interaction. This is why participation in fellowship times, attending Bible classes, or participating in a community group is so vital to develop stronger connections. It's a New Year, so I encourage you to start a new pattern for yourself!

As we start the New Year, who are you praying for that God would touch with His saving message? I encourage you to keep a list of two or three persons that you pray for and seek to witness the love of Jesus to them. You need not convert them, as we only plant the seeds and God does the conversion.

Our next **Discovering Grace** class is set for **February 4th & 5th**. The class meets on Saturday from 9 AM – 12 PM and on Sunday from 9:30 – 10:30 AM. Invite someone to attend! #### LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTION

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with McDonnell Elementary School (4010 Binderton Place Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies. You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



**First Stop** encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes. **First Stop** is located at 2820 Governors Drive. (35805).

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

#### **Volunteer Tips for providing meals:**

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! **3-4** servers are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to **First Stop** by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m.
- Lunch is served from 12 p.m. to 1 p.m.
