### **Making Room**

Easter is coming, but let's not get ahead of ourselves. First, we must faithfully walk through our time in the wilderness. Before we can arrive at that powerful celebration of Jesus' resurrection victory over death, we must repent, we must confess. What the Israelites and Jesus both did literally, we must do figuratively – we must spend some time in the wilderness of Lent.

It is difficult to change our pace and alter our focus. We like our routines and our goals, and we are most comfortable when we orient our lives around them. Lent asks us to adjust our routines and our patterns. Lent asks us to spend time intentionally turning away from sin. Lent asks us to spend a little more time in worship. Lent asks us to perhaps fast from something important to us so that we might identify with our Savior Jesus who not only was tempted in the wilderness, but also gave up so much out of His love for us.

It can be hard to make room for the things that Lent asks us to do. This week I drove to St. Louis to participate in a Synod-wide pilot program aimed at encouraging young men and women to consider serving the church as full-time church workers. This drive forced me to navigate all of the traffic both Nashville and St. Louis could throw in my direction. While it has been in vogue to complain about Huntsville traffic lately, I welcome it compared to that through which I recently traversed! The Lenten analogy is this: There were many congested onramps onto the interstate that I navigated during the trip. There I was in the right hand lane, with an onramp approaching. Do I make room for the car attempting to merge, or do I not make room for the car attempting to merge? Better yet, which car do I allow to merge into MY lane? The Honda or the Volvo? While we walk through the wilderness of Lent, we recognize that God wants to merge into lanes of our lives in various ways. The devil and worldly cares also desire to merge into the lanes of our lives in various ways.

This battle takes place all of the time, but during Lent we give special attention to it. Sometimes, we allow the wrong party to merge in, but thanks be to God for the cross of Christ in which we glory, marveling at it as it not only towers over the wrecks of time, but also over the wrecks of our lives.

WORSHIP | GROW | ENGAGE is our discipleship focus. Disciple making is a process that needs ongoing attention. Jesus commands us to make disciples. We are EACH to be disciplemakers. What priority are you giving to being a disciple? Do not leave it to the church/school staff to do the discipling! Are you keeping your eyes and ears open to opportunities to build connections with someone and be ready to share your faith story?



We thank God for the blessings of increased church attendance along with participation in Bible Class/Sunday School! Grace Lutheran desires to serve more people as many are searching for Gospel news about Jesus and what He has done for each of us! We currently have weekly worship attendance of more than 300 between both services, and Sunday School/Bible class attendance in the 175 range.

We face a challenge with the need for more parking space while maximizing church attendance. We want to be user friendly to guests and members who struggle with ease of mobility. Consider the following to help with our parking needs near the church sanctuary. If you enjoy good mobility, we encourage you to drop off your spouse/family members at the entrance to the sanctuary and park your vehicle in the parking lot behind the old gym or on the south side of the Annex building. If your family is bringing two cars to worship/Bible class, park one in a more remote area. We are looking at ways we could make it easier to use more distant parking. (Note: Please leave the handicap parking spaces for persons having handicap access!) A golf cart that seats 4 could help to shuttle people. It also means that perhaps arriving a few minutes earlier will help you to find spaces that will leave parking for newcomers. Your cars are safe in the parking lot behind the old gym as we have safety ushers who check the premises and parking areas throughout the morning.

You can also help by being willing to sit in the front of the church. Guests prefer to have seating in open spaces closer to the back of the church. Also, be willing to move to the center of a pew so that people can fill in at the ends.

We are kingdom focused as we seek to serve more people and see God add them as members of His body. We give thanks to God for His ongoing blessings as we continue to serve people. I am pleased to see the different links our new visitors have as they join us (Family members, CDC & school families, Lutheran ties).

I encourage you to PRAY for our congregation and for each other! Prayer is a vital tool that can move "mountains." Prayer is a vital tool as we seek to acquire additional parking along with praying for God to help us as we each invite others to join in worship at Grace Lutheran. I encourage you to pray specifically each day for two or three people in your contact circle that you desire for God to add as a member of His church. What a movement of prayer and blessing that God will add to His church!

To grow in congregational health, take time to get know others who you do not know when we gather for worship and Bible study. Take time to build connections and relationships! We will be healthier as a congregation as persons grow in connections! We desire to be a welcoming community! Invest the time and extend a hand of welcome saying, "I have not meet you. I am ....". Your words of welcome and getting to know others is vital as part of our overall congregational health.

### LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with McDonnell Elementary School (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies. You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



**First Stop** encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

#### Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! 3-4 servers are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to First Stop by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m.
- Lunch is served from 12 p.m. to 1 p.m.

### **Love Packages**

Love Packages is a local ministry in Decatur which ships Bibles and other Christian materials (new and used) to impoverished churches worldwide, free to recipients. Grace Lutheran Church has participated for several decades by collecting Bibles, Sunday School, VBS, Bible Study, and Devotional (i.e. Portals of Prayer) materials. Saints Alive and Steve and Nancy Rice take these materials over to Love Packages in Decatur usually twice a year.

### **Transitions**

What do you think of when you hear the word "transition"? Do you think of transition of seasons or life transitions or more simply, in writing, a word or phrase that connects one idea to another? Whatever you think of when you hear "transition," it involves "change" and many times a "transforming change."



Some transitions, such as from winter to spring, are uplifting as we witness God's beautiful creation coming to life in the flowers that spring up. Other transitions that involve our lives may not be easy. We may be overwhelmed with emotions and feelings related to the changes occurring. Job had many transitions in his life, as he went from "having it all" to "having nothing." He lost his possessions, his children, and his own health. However, through it all, he refused to curse or blame God. What strength... what faith he had. He was a transformed man.

Isaiah 43:1-3 reminds us of God's presence. "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior." God's people will face trials, but we have the promises of God's presence and salvation. That's right, God has redeemed you, saved you from your sin and made you His own child.

Transformation is pervasive in the Bible because it is part of God's redemption! Paul said in Romans 12:2: "Do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." This transformation occurs in our thoughts and actions.

Whatever transition you are going through right now, remember God redeems and will bring transformation through the Holy Spirit.
