In order to qualify, they must race in a series of races leading up to the Kentucky Derby, appropriately referred to as *The Road to the Kentucky Derby*. Twenty horses qualify, and they wear numbers 1-20 in the race, ordered according to the qualifying points they earned on *The Road to the Kentucky Derby*. But in 2022, one of the horses and his jockey wore the number 21. That's because the horse that finished 20<sup>th</sup> in the qualifying races was scratched from the Kentucky Derby because he wasn't ready to race. It was a late scratch, too.

In fact, he was the last one out and even seemed to stumble a little. Watching the race was inspiring, because against all odds, he won. Rich Strike did not qualify for the race, he had the worst starting position, and he came out of the gate poorly. He started the race dead last. But when the race was over, he had gone from worst to first, and proudly wore the wreath.

The Ministry of Grace Lutheran Church and School this Fall feels like the beginning of a big race. But the course is a lot longer and more arduous than a one mile dirt track. - We are now officially under contract to purchase the Gibson's property.
- Pray that our environmental study yields good results.
- The BoD is currently reaching out to architecture firms to hear about their interest and availability, and to hear what their process would look like.

"And we're off..." in asking God's help to identify an Associate Pastor that can serve Christ's kingdom in this place, and help us to capitalize on the multitude of ministry opportunities that God is placing before us.

- August 31-September 1 Pastor Daniel Guagenti will participate in an onsite visit and interview with our Call Committee.
- September 6-9 Pastor Christopher Schneider will participate in an onsite visit and interview with our Call Committee.
- Next steps to be determined following the interviews.

It may feel like a race, but in reality we are just the people of God, celebrating the gifts of God, and trying our best to best to faithfully serve in the Kingdom of God. "And we're off!"

Most churches are great at maintenance. Yet, they are declining and aging—the median age is rising. If that is your church, you need to act now. You'll never get everyone trained in mission principles. It's all right to start with a few. Outreach is not simply a program. It's a movement. Jesus started with 12."

### LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with **McDonnell Elementary School** (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. **We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies.** You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



**First Stop** encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

#### **Volunteer Tips for providing meals:**

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! 3-4 servers are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to First Stop by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m.
- Lunch is served from 12 p.m. to 1 p.m.

### Beyond the Fog

Frequently the past few weeks, I have awakened to fog. It doesn't seem like the sun will rise. As I prepare to leave the house to head over the mountain, I know the trip will be slowed by lack of vision in the fog. I'm always more cautious and alert in the fog. I find myself fearful of hitting the deer that jumps out of nowhere, or worse yet, the car in front of me that suddenly stops. But today on my trip, God reminded me of a very important promise. As I drove up the mountain, the sky suddenly cleared and the sun shone brightly. Through my rear view mirror I could see the fog behind me in the valley. I stopped at the top of the mountain, as I often do, to look over the city. The sky was so bright with the sun shining, yet the valley was covered in fog so thick, it appeared the mountain ended just a few hundred feet away.



Isn't this like life at times? When we are in our valleys of pain, our vision is clouded with fears. We may feel lost and alone...But wait. Psalm 121:1-8 reminds us, "I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help. My help cometh from the Lord, which made heaven and earth. He will not suffer thy foot to be moved: he that keepeth thee will not slumber. Behold, he that keepeth Israel shall neither slumber nor sleep. Praise God for the reminder that Psalm 121 provides. God assures us that we do not walk alone - the Maker of heaven and earth journeys with us as our helper at all times and in all places. No one is nearer to you than our God, who will always protect you from evil. God never tires, or loses sight, of our needs. As we look to our past, we see that he has brought us through the fog. He has promised to provide for us in the present and preserve us in the future.
