Children Dealing with Grief

General Tips:

- Be honest with your children
- Answer their questions with simple, clear answers
- Do not use words like "sleep" instead of "death"
- Encourage children to identify and express their feelings
- Share your feelings with your children
- Find ways to express grief through talking, play, coloring, etc.
- Recall the good memories of the person
- Stick to your routines as much as possible
- Expect some sort of unusual behavior

Faith Tips:

- Explain that sometimes God answers prayers with a "yes" and a "no"
- Even if a loved one dies, we know that Jesus defeated death to give us eternal life
- Discuss the reality of Heaven

Activities:

- Cry
- Laugh and be silly on purpose
- Try something new
- Create a memory book
- Give someone a hug
- Do something nice for another person
- Talk with an adult about how you are feeling

Advent Prayer Star

This interactive prayer activity will guide you through the steps of building your own Moravian star and challenge you to pray throughout the season of Advent for people and situations that are in need of the light of Christ.


The Moravian star was first seen in Germany nearly 200 years ago at a school. It is thought that this complicated star began as a geometry lesson. The star is a symbol for Jesus who came into the world and who declared "I am the Light of the World."

The points of the star radiating out from the center represent Jesus' love for us and the world. The traditional Moravian star has 26 points, but the star that we are constructing has 20 points. It will take nearly all of Advent to construct your star and with each point that is added you will be praying.



When author and pastor Eugene Peterson was speaking about Jesus coming as the light of the world, he asked, "As Christ followers, how are each one of us pushing back against the darkness?" This Advent season, push back against the darkness through prayer and asking Jesus to shine through you!





Advent Prayer Star Scriptures

- **A. Ephesians 5:8:** At one time you were in the dark. But now you are in the light because of what the Lord has done. Live like children of the light.
- **B. 1 John 1:5:** Here is the message we have heard from him and announce to you. God is light. There is no darkness in him at all.
- **C. John 1:7:** But suppose we walk in the light, just as he is in the light. Then we share life with one another. And the blood of Jesus, his Son, makes us pure from all sin.
- **D. John 8:12:** Jesus spoke to the people again. He said, "I am the light of the world. Anyone who follows me will never walk in darkness. They will have that light. They will have life."
- **E. John 1:1-2:** In the beginning, the Word was already there. The Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning.
- F. John 1:4: Life was in him, and that life was the light for all people.
- G. John 1:5: The light shines in the darkness. But the darkness has not overcome the light.



- **H. John 1:14:** The Word became a human being. He made his home with us. We have seen his glory. It is the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father. And the Word was full of grace and truth.
- **I. Luke 1:79:** God will help those who live in darkness, in the fear of death. He will guide us into the path that goes toward peace.
- J. Revelation 22:5: There will be no more night. They will not need the light of a lamp or the light of the sun. The Lord God will give them light. They will rule for ever and ever.

 K. Isaiah 9:2: The people who are now living in darkness will see a great light. They are now living in a very dark land. But a light will shine on them.

Advent Prayer Star Scriptures

- L. Isaiah 60:1: Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you
- M. 1 Peter 2:9: But God chose you to be his people. You are royal priests. You are a holy nation. You are God's special treasure. You are all these things so that you can give him praise. God brought you out of darkness into his wonderful light.
- **N. Matthew 5:14-15:** You're the light of the world. A town built on a hill can't be hidden. Also, people do not light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand. Then it gives light to everyone in the house.
- **O. Matthew 5:16:** In the same way, let your light shine so others can see it. Then they will see the good things you do. And they will bring glory to your Father who is in heaven.
- P. Psalm 119:105: Your word is like a lamp that shows me the way. It is like a light that guides me.
- **Q. Isaiah 49:6 (The Message):** [God says] I'm setting you up as a light for the *nations* so that my salvation becomes *global!*



- **R. 1 Thessalonians 5:5-6a:** All of you are children of the light. You are children of the day. We don't belong to the night. We don't belong to the darkness. So let us not be like the others.
- **S. Philippians 2:14-15:** Do everything without complaining or arguing. Then you will be pure and without blame. You will be children of God without fault among sinful and evil people. Then you will shine among them like stars in the sky.
- **T. 2 Corinthians 4:6:** God said, "Let light shine out of darkness." (<u>Genesis 1:3</u>) He made his light shine in our hearts. His light gives us the light to know God's glory. His glory is shown in the face of Christ.

Advent Prayer Star Directions

(1 of 2)

- 1. Cut out star body (vellum) on solid lines.
- 2. Cut out 20 star points on solid lines.
- 3. Score the star body and all the star points. It is much easier to get clean folds on your star if you score the paper by going over the dashed lines with a pen (you can use a ruler to help keep the lines straight). If you have small children, you might want to do this prep work without them.

Supplies:

Star template
Star points (20)
Tape
Glue dots
Finishing nail
LED light
Scissors*
Pen*
Ruler*
*Home supplies

4. Put together the star base by folding all the lines you have scored and taping the sides together. It is easier if you make all the folds, before you start taping (See Figure 1).



5. Place a small piece of tape on one flap and tape to the side near it so that all the tape is on the inside of the star body. Leave one flap not taped down so it looks like Figure 2. This flap you've created will allow you to access the LED light in order to turn the light on and off.



Advent Prayer Star Directions

(2 of 2)

Each day of Advent, add one star point to your base. Don't be stressed if this doesn't happen daily for your family; there are a few more days during Advent than there are star points. If you get behind, just add several star points when you can.

- 1. On a star point, write something or someone that you want the light of Jesus to shine on. Have each family member add something to the star point. Pray together and finish with "may the light of Jesus shine on _____."
- 2. Use your finishing nail to poke some holes in the paper (see Figure 3). As you do this, ask God to show you how the light of Jesus might shine through you onto this person or situation. Pray "Light of Jesus, shine through me."
- 3. Tape your star point closed by folding into a 3 sided pyramid and then taping it closed (Figure 4). Fold in the bottom flaps.

4. Select a letter on your star body. Read the Scripture that corresponds to that letter.

Add 3 glue dots to the 3 triangle points of that letter and then attach your star point (Figure 5).

- 5. Turn on your LED light by twisting it and place it inside the star body by opening the flap you did not tape. Pray "Lord Jesus, we need more of your light in our world. Please shine through me. Amen."
- 6. Repeat these steps throughout Advent until your Prayer Star is complete.
