Jesus Must Increase

We had a big conversation among staff and our Elders' Ministry Team about what to do about Christmas this year. It may seem like a long way out now, but trust me, it is right around the corner, and it will be here *before* we are ready for it. The conversation revolved around how many services to have and when to have them. The critical pieces of information that we attempted to balance were:

- Christmas Eve is on a Sunday
- Everyone enjoys a full church on Christmas Eve
- •Some people are out of town on Christmas Eve
- •453 people attended Christmas Eve services last year
- •521 people attended Easter services this year
- •Our Sanctuary has a maximum capacity of 250 people

It was a conversation worth having, and it is far from the only conversation worth having right now. We will soon have a special visitor here at Grace from November 11-13 as Pastor Christopher Schneider, who is considering a Call to serve as the Associate Pastor, will be here with his family to visit our Church and community as he discerns God's Will for him. On November 12, we will hold Fellowship in the gym to give Pastor Chris and his family the opportunity to meet some of our members. His Call and upcoming visit has led to great conversations like, what will it be like to have an Associate Pastor at Grace? Where are the places that we have the greatest opportunity for additional ministry? Where will the Associate Pastor's office be located?

These are good conversations to have. We are now in the final thirty days of the due diligence time frame for our purchase of the Gibson's property on the north side of our campus. The environmental studies have been completed and have yielded good results. We have spoken to the current tenants of the leased buildings on the property to build relationships with our neighbors. And now it's time to have the conversations about the needs of all three phases of our ministry for the next twenty years as we seek to put together a master plan.

Are you keeping your eyes and ears open to opportunities to build connections with someone in your neighborhood/community and be ready to share your faith story? Share your story of what Jesus has done and continues to do for you! Feel free to invite them to worship with you on Sunday!



Our Missional Calling – The state of our culture does not change our missional calling. We are living in a rapidly changing time which has caused a major cultural and communications shift since the reformation. This shift has led to decreasing church attendance and increased tension between people. Despite this, Jesus calls us to make disciples as we go, regardless of the tension and challenges that may be present. Watch this brief <u>video</u> by Rev. Matt Peeples.

We received this note from **First Stop**: I just want to say thank you all for the donations that you all made. This was a huge help to First Stop's Day Center. We have been out of a few items and donations have been low, so thank you again. These donations will have us set for a while.

Grace Lutheran is hosting the **Southern/Mid-South District Teachers' Conference** from **November 19-21**. We will have educators here from six different states: Louisiana, Alabama, Florida, Tennessee, Kentucky, and Arkansas. Their hotel will be at Springhill Suites in the downtown area. The theme is **Because He Cares** based on 1 Peter 5:7. We ask for your prayers as we host this conference while giving thanks for the ministries of Lutheran schools and early childhood centers!

Let us remember the importance of prayer as we lift each other and celebrate the hope and peace we have in Jesus! This is the month of Thanksgiving! Take time to share your prayers with God and for others! Are there needs in your family or neighborhood? If so, let us know how we can respond!

Jesus started the disciple-making movement by focusing on a few. He poured His life into them. Look at Luke 12:1-2. It says that "...the crowd...numbered in the thousands." However, Jesus' primary concern was with His disciples (Luke 12:47-48). What does that say to you? Are you interested in crowds or are you interested in disciples? Raising disciples is a long, slow, one-on-one, relational activity (Church Doctor Ministries). How are you participating in this disciple-making process?

LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with McDonnell Elementary School (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies. You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



First Stop encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! 3-4 servers are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to **First Stop** by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM.
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.
- Lunch is served from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM.

SAINTS ALIVE

Saints Alive is a senior adult ministry that chooses a variety of activities and places to visit! The activities are scheduled for the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month.

Upcoming Activities

The Saints Alive will have an opportunity to hear the Redstone Arsenal archaeologist, **Ben Hoksbergen**, speak on **November 15** at **10:00 AM**. He will be speaking here at the Grace Lutheran facility. The sign-up sheet is posted on the bulletin board in the church lobby. Lunch will follow at **Outback Steakhouse** on Whitesburg Drive.

It may come as a surprise that Redstone Arsenal is one of the most concentrated archaeological site areas in the United States. "The Tennessee Valley in general is a very rich area," Hoksbergen said. "Redstone has 950 sites within Army property alone. The oldest artifact we have found on the Arsenal, a spear point, dates back 13,000 years. They have found everything from decorated pottery, ceramic trowels, axes, arrowheads, and even a Spanish coin that was dated 1782."

"The coolest thing I have found was an intact Confederate belt buckle on an old house site that was owned by a Confederate veteran," Hoksbergen said. "Since we had the property info on the man who previously lived there, we were actually able to trace the buckle to a particular person, which makes it a more valuable find."

"My favorite part of the job is still just finding stuff," Hoksbergen said. "Even though I have found thousands of arrowheads, I still get excited. Sometimes I get information out of a dig that totally changes my perspective or contributes to science. It's the cool items and information that comes out of a dig that keeps me going."

Saints and Sinners

Saint and Sinner...that's me! Really? It's easy to confess that I am a sinner. However, saying I'm a saint can feel awkward. According to Martin Luther, all Christians are simultaneously sinner and saint. How can that be? It's because we are sinners due to our rebellious nature and saints due to our salvation in Jesus. So as a "saint," I am a forgiven sinner. We are called saints not because we change into something different, but because our relationship with God changes as a result of God's grace.



In Ephesians 1:11-23, Paul reminds us "that in Him, we have obtained an inheritance..." ¹³In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, ¹⁴who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, the praise of his glory. ¹⁵For this reason, because I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, ¹⁶I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, ¹⁷that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, ¹⁸having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, ¹⁹and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of his great might ²⁰that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, ²¹far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come. ²²And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, ²³which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

As we start November, we will celebrate All Saints' Day, at which time we remember the "saints" that have passed away since the last All Saints celebration. This is a time to look back and remember those who have died in Christ during the past year. We remember these "saints" and give thanks for the lives they lived. We reaffirm our belief in Jesus and our hope in our guaranteed, glorious inheritance. All Saints' Day is a day on which we remember all of the faithful who have gone before us and give thanks to God that by his mercy he receives sinners and gives us the same hope that he gave to them: the hope of the coming resurrection.


