Setting the Mind to Work

In 586 B.C., the Southern Kingdom of Judah fell to the Babylonians. In 539 B.C., Babylon fell to the Medes and the Persians, and in 536 B.C., the first wave of Jewish exiles returned to the Holy Land. Then, in 445 B.C., Nehemiah heard about the struggles that the Jewish remnant was having in Jerusalem. Nehemiah was the cupbearer of King Artaxerxes of Persia, and he asked the king if he would be willing to send him back to the holy city of Jerusalem to help them in the rebuilding of the wall. King Artaxerxes agreed, and Nehemiah went back to Jerusalem with a big goal in mind. When Nehemiah and the workers started the audacious project of rebuilding the wall, they were mocked by Sanballat (a Samaritan leader) and the Samaritan army as they worked. They were ridiculed. Sanballat taunted them asking the question, "What are these feeble Jews doing?" (Nehemiah 4:2). Tobiah the Ammonite mocked them saying, "Yes, what they are building—if a fox goes up on it he will break down their stone wall!" (Nehemiah 4:3). But Nehemiah prayed to the Lord, asking for his help, and in Nehemiah 4:6, Nehemiah reported, "So we built the wall. And all the wall was joined together to half its height, for the people had a mind to work." It was a bold, audacious project, and with their minds set to work, the wall was completed in only 52 days.

Now that we have purchased property to give us needed room for seizing the Kingdom opportunities that God continues to put before us, many have been asking how we are going to use that property for ministry. Unlike Nehemiah's project, ours will certainly not be forever preserved in the pages of the Holy Scriptures, and it will certainly take more than 52 days to complete! Yet how God will use this project to His glory is a healthy curiosity to keep in the forefront of our minds as we move forward. With that in mind, I wanted to give you an update on the progress being made.

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Architect Selection Process

A key component of our project will be the development of a feasible master facility plan for our entire campus. The Board of Directors is currently interviewing architecture firms with the goal of selecting one to assist us in the development of that plan. The Board has already met with Chapman | Sisson, and in the month of March the Board has scheduled meetings with Nola | VanPeursem, Fuqua and Partners Architects, and The Aspen Group. After these interviews are complete, the Board will select a firm to engage with. If all of our meetings take place as scheduled, we hope to have a firm selected around Easter. At that time, the Board will form a committee to work with the selected architecture firm in developing a feasible master plan that we pray God will use to connect others to Jesus for all eternity.

Capital Investment Campaign Committee

In addition to developing a master plan, we also must work on funding the purchase of the property and the construction of buildings. The first phase of the campaign will be to work toward paying off the debt incurred from the purchase of the property. We give thanks to Mike Ellis, Kristin Haycock, Wade and Jan Foster, and Bekah Schmidt for their willingness to serve on this team. In the months and weeks ahead, you will see this giving opportunity published and encouraged across our ministries.

Setting our Minds to Work

Those working on the wall were able persist in their building despite the taunting and hurdles that were before them because God had set their minds to work. We continue to pray that God would bless us with a spirit of persistence, that depending on Him we might seize the Kingdom opportunities He has placed before us.

LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with McDonnell Elementary School (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies. You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



First Stop encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! 3-4 servers are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to **First Stop** by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM.
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.
- Lunch is served from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM.

Talk to the hand. . . Do you hear me now?

Do you remember the commercial where the person moved around and kept asking, "Do you hear me now?" Or what about the phrase, "Talk to the hand!" "Talk to the hand" is a slang phrase that originated as a sarcastic way of saying one does not want to hear what the person who is speaking is saying. The focus is on "hearing," but there's no listening involved. Listening on the other hand, takes effort. Listening is focused, voluntary and intentional.

Noise is what we hear and is involuntary and effortless. How many times do you have the television on and someone asks you what was just said and you look up and acknowledge you heard it, but you have no idea what was said as you were not listening...it was just noise. There's a lot of noise in the world.

We have a God who not only hears us, but LISTENS to every prayer. As we study Prayer during Lent, we are reminded of how important it is to pray, and the many prayers of the Bible. So many times we say we "don't know what to do," but as Pastor reminded us, that's when our faith reminds us to "follow God's lead." God will show us the way. God speaks to us in many ways, but do we "listen" when he speaks?

So when you pray, pray with confidence. God will listen and always keeps his promises. He answers prayer in ways that align with His will. 1 John 5:14-15 says, "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him." Remember Psalm 139:4-6 as you pray. "Before a word is on my tongue you, LORD, know it completely. You hem me in behind and before, and you lay your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain."

Stephen Ministers are available to listen and journey with you through difficult times in life, such as losses through death, illness, aging, or broken relationships. The Stephen Minister will be "present" to reflect and help you connect with God's presence in your life.
