## God Grant Us Strength

"He is Risen! He is Risen Indeed, Alleluia!" May the triumphant joy of Christ's victory over the grave be so abundant in you that it overflows into the lives of those around you! As we have now shifted from the season of Lent into the joyous season of Easter, we celebrate the victory of the empty tomb and the work that God is doing in us and through us. This year, the month of April brings a particularly joyous Easter season as we see God's hand at work through several exciting developments in our ministry.

#### GraceLand Capital Campaign

In December of 2023 Grace Lutheran Church and School finalized the purchase of a little more than 3 acres of property that is connected to the north side of our campus. This property provides us with much-needed space to continue to seize the opportunities for the Gospel that God is placing before us. Purchasing the property required us to take on \$3.2 million in debt. For the next three years, the interest rate on that debt is at a reduced rate of 4%. The GraceLand Capital Campaign is kicking off in the month of April as we attack that debt, and payoff as much as possible before the three year term with reduced interest expires.

This week our Board of Directors is finishing up their interviews of architecture firms. The Board will select one of those firms for our ministry to work with to help us develop a master facility plan. Reducing (or paying off) our land debt will be a necessary first step before we can develop the land for ministry use. The months ahead will be exciting months for us as we seek God's wisdom in developing plans that will help us to carry out His ministry in this place. God loves a cheerful giver, and supporting the GraceLand Capital Campaign with your generosity is a great way to ensure that we continue to be a beacon of light shining the Gospel of Christ in our community.

### **Associate Pastor Reveal**

This year for Easter Sunday 585 people heard the Gospel and received the sacrament of Holy Communion as they worshiped at Grace Lutheran. That is a 12% increase in worshippers from Easter Sunday 2023 and a 44% increase in worshipers from 2022. What opportunities God is placing before us! Seeing these ministry opportunities, our congregation voted to seek out an Associate Pastor to join us in ministry at Grace. A Call Committee was formed, and in addition to considering candidates from the field, they also approached Concordia Seminary St. Louis about seeing if a new seminary graduate might be a good fit for our ministry. Interviews were performed, our congregation voted to extend a Call to a seminary graduate, and we have been notified that **Concordia Seminary will be filling our Call.** 

Each year Concordia Seminary hosts Call Day, where those graduating from the Seminary receive their first Calls. Call Day is a special, complete worship service during which each graduating candidate's name is called and the congregation they will be serving is announced. The Call Service is **April 23rd** at **7:00 PM**. It is held at the Chapel of St. Timothy and Titus at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, and the service is livestreamed. We will host a watch party here at Grace for anyone wanting to gather with other church members to celebrate God's provision. When the day gets closer, we will also send out the link so that you can tune in at home and see who our Associate Pastor will be.

### Pardon our Progress - Office Shuffle

As a new Pastor will be joining us in ministry, we looked at our current office arrangement and came to the conclusion that a centralized church office hub would be helpful for team ministry. This office work is already underway. It will make a little mess and take a little time, but the finished product will help us be more efficient in ministry. Here are the changes you will see:

- The CDC resource room will become the infant room for the Child Development Center.
- The Church Library will become the CDC resource room.
- The current Pastor's Office will become the Church Library.
- The current infant room will become the new church office. This space will have enough office space for our church office staff, our Associate Pastor, and me.
- The current Church Office Manager office will become the CDC office.

We look forward to the synergy that a centralized church office area will create for our ministry team. Pray for Jack and his team as they seek to get all of this accomplished before our new Associate Pastor arrives this summer.

### LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with **McDonnell Elementary School** (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. **We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies.** You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.

**First Stop** encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

# First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

#### Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! **3-4 servers** are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to First Stop by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM.
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.
- Lunch is served from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM.

In Search of Good News By Merle Trich



When was the last time you listened or watched the news on television and thought to yourself... "That news really made me feel good. That story gave me a positive start to my day!" The news around us bombards us with stories of war, death, and evil... The "bad news."

The good news is that God loves us! John 3:15-18 says "that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God." We have "good news" available all the time in the Gospel...every day, all day, always. However, we know the "good news" came through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ for our sins! As sinners, we deserve Hell and the wrath of God, the "bad news." However, through God's love for us, he sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to redeem us. We need to know the bad news before we can truly appreciate the good news. If we don't recognize the sin, we can't appreciate the "good news" of redemption by a Savior.

We can experience the good news, peace, joy, and hope through our repentance and relationship with God. Romans 10:8-9 says "But what does it say? The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart (that is the word of faith that we proclaim); because, if you confess with our mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."

So, as we watch all the bad news, remember to pray for forgiveness and redemption, turn to the Bible to read the "good news," and thank God for his love, mercy, and grace.

We are all part of God's family. He brings good news to us daily through His word and the people of our Christian community and church family. May God bless you with His "good news".


