The Maycember Finish Line

Everyone loves crossing a finish line. Whether the race was a marathon or a sprint, whether you dragged yourself to the end or finished strong, whether the race was literal or figurative, crossing the finish line brings relief. You can catch your breath, regroup, and rest.

We have just completed the month of May, or as you may have heard it referred to by others, Maycember. The portmanteau "Maycember" was coined back in 2016 by The Holderness Family, content creators popular for their videos on marriage, middle-age, and parenting, but it has become a bigger part of the cultural lexicon in recent years, popping up in news stories and as a topic on morning talk shows. The term is defined as "the whirlwind of events, obligations, and celebrations that crowd the month of May, making it feel as hectic and overwhelming as the holiday season in December." There are concerts, recitals, awards ceremonies, field days, field trips, graduations, sports practices and games, and a number of other events that the school invites parents to attend in the middle of a weekday. As a parent of three school-age children, our schedule was full, and while there is much to enjoy in all of these activities, the stress and exhaustion resulting from trying to keep up with everything while also attending to work and other household responsibilities can be a thief of some of that joy. It was a relief to turn the calendar page from the color-coded chaos of May to a month with a few more empty squares. We finally have a chance to catch our breath, regroup, and rest.

Grace Lutheran had a bit of its own Maycember, especially if you extend it back to include the last few weeks of April. We crossed the finish line of the Lenten season by celebrating the resurrection of our Savior on Easter. We celebrated six of our youth as they confirmed their faith in front of the congregation. We hosted the LERT training that had been rescheduled from the beginning of the year. We voted on a Master Plan to pursue in order to accommodate our growing ministries. We welcomed new members and honored graduates. Grace Lutheran School wrapped up their academic year, and we voted to issue a call to another principal candidate. Lastly, a large group of our members and their families attended a Trash Panda game to enjoy fellowship together. Pastor Russ and Pastor Andrew have faithfully shepherded our congregation through all of these events, while Pastor Andrew crossed some personal finish lines of his own as he and Hannah closed on their first home together and got married. They were able to celebrate the end of those races by taking off for their honeymoon, and Pastor Russ is currently enjoying a family trip out West visiting some of the national parks. They all are getting to catch their breath, regroup, and rest.

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Lay Leadership

As we cross the various finish lines in our personal lives and as a church, and enjoy a slower pace, it's also important to continue looking forward. Hebrews 12:1 tells us, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us." The finish line for this race is not the end of a month, or a season, or a particular event. This is the race of our earthly life as Christians, and the finish line is eternity in Heaven, whenever God calls us home. Until then, we press on. Ministry continues here at Grace throughout the summer. VBS begins tonight, and the hard work of church staff and volunteers will come to fruition as children learn about Jesus through games, songs, and activities. The CDC continues to provide Christ-centered childcare for both our members and members of the Huntsville community. Summer Camp kicks off this week, serving school families and functioning as an outreach opportunity to those outside of Grace. We will begin the Red Letter Challenge, focusing on strengthening our discipleship. Work is being done to prepare our budget for the next fiscal year, and that along with future ministry plans will be discussed at a Voters' Assembly Meeting later this month. And before we know it, it will be time to prepare for the upcoming school year, and the pace of everyday life will pick up once again.

There is Kingdom work to be done in our personal lives as well, whether that be through our jobs, volunteer opportunities, community engagements, or even simply within our own families. May we draw strength from rest while looking for ways to spread the Gospel to those around us.

LERT Training Recap

And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up.

It finally happened! What started in the middle of September finally found its conclusion on a very wet weekend in May.

Back in September, Pastor Russ and I were getting excited about a mission trip opportunity to visit our mission partners at Child Beyond International in Guatemala. We were so excited that we didn't leave for the airport in time and we missed our flight. Rebooking the flight didn't go very well because at that same moment in time Hurricane Helene was preparing to make landfall. Pastor and I decided to not take the flight down. Other than the moral of that story being to not travel with me (plenty of stories on that for other times) I learned another lesson that day: pay attention to what God is doing and how he is leading you.

Following our failed Guatemala trip, it seemed as though God was telling us "no." It also seemed as though God was pointing us to another place where we could Engage in service, through disaster relief with LERT (Lutheran Early Response Team). The effects of Helene are well known; communities in the Carolinas continue to recover and will be rebuilding for years. What if God was calling us to serve our neighbors much closer than Guatemala? What if our neighbors were only states away?

We began 2025 excited about LERT training, but our first attempt found a frozen pause. The weekend we had scheduled got snowed out; it turns out there is a limit to "this training will occur rain or shine," and Southerners don't handle snow very well. What a bummer! We'd have to delay this training for warmer weather. And it finally happened! A few weekends ago Grace hosted a LERT training event. We had people from across the South, from Louisiana to Kentucky, come to Grace for disaster training. On the afternoon of May 10th, a very brave chainsaw class ventured into the "rain or shine" (it was a deluge). Over 20 people received LERT training through the weekend. In this one training the Southern District tripled the amount of chainsaw certified operators for disaster situations.

Where does this lead us next? Who knows? God continues to mess with us and point us in directions as we Engage in service. We look forward to future conversations with LERT officials as we build a team and discover ways in which we can effectively care for our brothers and sisters in God's kingdom. God has given us an amazing opportunity, let's go out and take it.

LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with McDonnell Elementary School (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies. You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



First Stop encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! 3-4 servers are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to **First Stop** by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM.
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.
- Lunch is served from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM.

Saints Alive is an adult organization within Grace Lutheran Ministries. The group is open to Grace Lutheran members and their friends. There will be two sheets, one will be for those riding the bus and the other for those who are planning to drive themselves. This just makes it easier for us to keep track of when the bus is full.

Summer Plans

The Saints Alive group continues to provide opportunities to explore topics and places around north Alabama and southern Tennessee. We welcome all who would like to join us for our experiences.

June brings the end to 2025's first six months of planned activities for Saints Alive. Two more events are planned until we hold another **Planning Meeting** for the rest of the year. That planning meeting is scheduled for **Wednesday**, **June 25th at 10:00 AM** in the **Genesis Room**, followed by lunch nearby. All are invited to attend the meeting. The planned activities will cover the months of July through November. Our annual Christmas dinner will be held in December. Please think about some possible activities in north Alabama or southern Tennessee or some topics that could be presented by someone on the Grace campus.

During June there are two activities planned. First on **June 5th** (a Thursday due to when the restaurant we are visiting is open) we will travel to **Ivy Green**, the home of Helen Keller, in Tuscumbia. We will tour the house and grounds. For the second June activity we will host **Patty Sykstus**, the co-founder and CEO of **Not One More Alabama (NOMA)**. NOMA began in November of 2016 when a group of family members and professionals began collaborating to discuss the impact of addiction on families in the state of Alabama. Realizing that other interventions had good intentions but produced extremely poor results, the group formed NOMA and decided to step forward and share their personal experiences, knowledge, hope, and support with those impacted by the disease of addiction. NOMA is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization founded and operated by compassionate individuals who volunteer their support, education, and inspiration to those impacted by addiction. Funding is provided by donations and corporate contributions. A sign-up sheet will be on the easel in the narthex beginning **June 8th**. Lunch will follow the presentation at **Farm Burger** on Bob Wallace. Karen Ager is coordinating this event.

Weeds

I love to garden! I plant new flowers every year and tend to my blueberries, blackberries and herbs. I get so excited walking through the garden centers thinking of how all those beautiful plants would look in my yard. But then the rain comes and among all my gardens the weeds start to grow – stealing the nutrients and choking the flowers. I use weed suppressant, hand pull, and use "Grandpa's Weeder" for the deep, hard-to-get roots. Weeding is an ongoing process to keep my gardens vibrant and alive.

Galatians 5:22-25 says "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit."

In our lives it is easy for spiritual weeds of worry, anxiety, doubt, and sin to steal our joy in Christ. How many weeds are rooted in your life? Just like it's important to weed my flower garden, it's more important to weed my spiritual garden. Are we investing our energy and time in the fruits of the Spirit? What is distracting you from tending to your spiritual fruits? Is it social media, worries being reviewed in your mind, doubts, desire for what others have, focus on what others think versus what God wants for us?

Dealing with the weeds is a struggle, but it's worth it! In Colossians 3:5-11, Paul tells us to make sure we are dealing with our spiritual weeds. "Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature; Sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, all of which is idolatry. And, because of these, the wrath of God is coming. You used to walk in these ways, in the life you once lived. But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips. Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator. There is no Gentile or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave or free, but Christ is all, and is in all." So as we do our spiritual weeding and fight sin, may we do so with patience, hope, and gratitude for grace.

If you are looking for encouragement and strength during challenging circumstances in life and spiritual weeding, a Stephen Minister can listen and support you as you look for peace and hope in His Word. Red Letter Challenge Invitation

Discipleship is a life-long pursuit. At its most basic level, it simply means following Jesus. Discipleship is not merely knowledge, but it is not void of knowledge either. Discipleship is about putting into practice what Christ has revealed and spoken to us. Jesus modeled a whole life and even told us how to follow Him in HIS OWN WORDS (the red letters found in many Bibles). This summer our Summer Adult Sunday School will be embarking on the Red Letter Challenge (RLC). The RLC is a 40 day challenge aimed at mastering five discipleship targets: Being, Forgiving, Serving, Giving, and Going. Rocket City Scholarship Donation Instructions

Spring time is scholarship season at Grace Lutheran School. As a community we are blessed to be able to work with several scholarship organizations in addition to our Mamie Adams scholarship fund to help make Christian education affordable for families. Our most utilized external scholarship opportunity is Rocket City SGO. This is a scholarship granting organization which directs donations to students in Madison County who wish to participate in a private school program. The program is funded by donors, like you, who make 100% tax deductible donations to the program, which then offset their personal tax liability. Furthermore, when these donations are motivated by Grace Lutheran School we are credited for motivating those donations which increases the amount of scholarship dollars offered to our students.

For the upcoming school year, we have had 19 students apply for the Rocket City Scholarship. Given the funds we expect to receive, we anticipate that our allocation will cover roughly half of our current scholarship needs.
