It's High Tide in the Sanctuary

Let's Go for a Swim

Summer is in full swing, and it appears to be high tide in the sanctuary. At our June 22nd Voters' Assembly Meeting, I reported on our mild growth in worship attendance during the 2024-2025 ministry year. In previous ministry years we had increases of 21% (when coming out of Covid-19) and 6%. But not this year. While we saw and celebrated growth in worship attendance, it was much more modest at 2.5%. But then June arrived!

Typically worship attendance during the summer months recedes. Routines change, vacations are enjoyed, and attendance ticks down. But not this year, this June we witnessed the opposite. There is occasionally a Sunday, here or there, where worship attendance is unexpectedly and particularly high. There is no special music that day, there is no Baptism planned, it's not Easter or Christmas, but the sanctuary is so full that people have to make their way to the front row because it is the only space left. I refer to those Sundays as "rogue waves." It's like a wave that just came out of nowhere. But this June has been more like a long high tide. The water has rolled in, and it has stuck around.

Our worship attendance through the first four Sundays in June is 12% higher than it was last June. It is 7% higher than it was during the month of May. If you include Easter Sunday, our average worship attendance in June was still (just slightly) higher than our average attendance for January-May. If you remove Easter Sunday from the equation, our average worship attendance in June was 5% higher than it was for January-May. This is very unusual. It is high tide in the sanctuary, so let's go for a swim.

In Psalm 122, one of the great Psalms of Ascent, King David declared, "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord.'" In our discipleship process at Grace, WORSHIP is the starting place, because that is where the good stuff happens. It is the place where sins are forgiven through confession and absolution; it is the place where God's people hear from Him as He speaks to them in His Word; it is the place where the body and blood of Jesus provides forgiveness and nourishment for those who receive it in faith.

WORSHIP is the place where God is at work in His Church, and where God is at work in our lives. This high tide that we are experiencing shows that He is doing something significant among us. Surfs up, let's see where His waves take us.

Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything.

But because you say so, I will let down the nets."

Luke 5:5

We're over halfway through the Red Letter Challenge. It's been a blessing to walk through these challenges together as we both hear the words Jesus has for us and as we do the things he calls us to do. The other day, the challenge was based around this idea of "Because you say so, I will..." While these words aren't words that Jesus spoke, they are in response to what Jesus calls Peter to do.

As we follow Jesus, we learn to listen to the voice of our Savior and we respond to His gracious call. As I look at this passage from Luke, I can only wonder the thoughts that were going through Peter and Andrew's heads when Jesus told them to change what they were doing. Here are two men, skilled at their craft, in a very frustrating situation. I'm no fisherman myself—despite my namesake—but the feeling of frustration is one we all know well. Something we should be very capable of doing ends up with no result, and despite our best efforts, nothing bites. For Jesus to say something as simple as "throw the nets over the side," may sound a little silly. But the word of Jesus is more than the word of ordinary people.

The word of Jesus is one that Christians listen to and act upon. "My sheep know my voice, and I know them, and they follow me," Jesus says in John 10. Halfway through this challenge, how have you heard the voice of Jesus and responded? Peter responds in a way that calls us up to the challenge. "Because you say so, I will." Peter does what Jesus calls him to do, even through his frustrations. Are you listening for the voice of Jesus and seeing where He is at work?

Continue listening to Jesus and doing the things He calls you to. Continue hearing the voice of the Good Shepherd. May God bless you as you continue through the second half of the Red Letter Challenge.

LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with McDonnell Elementary School (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies. You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



First Stop encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! 3-4 servers are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to **First Stop** by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM.
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.
- Lunch is served from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM.

GriefShare Returns in August

We often hear that grieving is a process. That may be true, but it often can feel like a never-ending story or a very painful journey. If you are carrying the burden of grief, you do not need to carry it alone. I would like to encourage you to come to a special seminar and support group offered here at Grace Lutheran Church called GriefShare. The materials specifically address topics and issues for those who are grieving the death of a loved one.

GriefShare meets weekly for 13 weeks, and the content is Christ-centered and biblical. Each weekly video session features nationally-respected grief experts and real-life stories, followed by small group discussion about the topics presented. Each person receives a participant guide with valuable exercises, journaling options, tools, and articles for dealing with the daily challenges of grief. You will find this to be a place where you can be around people who understand the pain of your loss. You will be prayed for and learn valuable information that will help you through this difficult season of your life.

These sessions are open to any adult regardless of whether your experience is recent or in the past. The group is led by individuals who have personally experienced grief due to a loved one's death. Each leader is trained in facilitating a GriefShare support group. The \$20 registration fee includes materials. (Please don't allow this fee to keep you from attending; we do have scholarships available). Information about the weekly topics can be found on the GriefShare website. While you are on the website, we also encourage you to sign up for the free daily email encouragements. You will find them informative and comforting.

Our GriefShare group will begin meeting on **August 10th** from **2:00 PM – 4:00 PM** at Grace Lutheran Church in the Church Library. We hope you will consider joining us.

Please remember your loss is shared by others in this church and what you are experiencing is sometimes easier to bear knowing others are listening and do care.

Rebecca Hitt shares her experience attending GriefShare, excerpts below:

Death has been a part of my life for a very long time. My dad died two days after my fifth birthday. A few years go by and an uncle dies, two months later, my grandfather. Another couple of years, my last remaining grandparent – my Granny, Dad's mom. And so it continued, every couple of years, more death. Aunts, uncles, cousins. So many funerals.

I thought I was good at handling grief. Certainly, I had the practice. It was something I thought I knew about myself, a defining characteristic. But then Mom died last year. And suddenly, I wasn't good at handling grief. I was stuck in my grief and frustrated. Why wasn't is working this time? What was wrong with me? Why couldn't I just get over it?

Turns out I wasn't good at grief. I was good at not grieving, not dealing with it. I was good at being sad and then trying desperately to shove all the hard emotions down in a box so I wouldn't have to truly do anything with them.

With some encouragement from David, I joined the GriefShare class at Grace in January. I was a little skeptical that "just sharing my grief" with others would do much but decided it wouldn't hurt to try. I was very wrong. I'm glad I did.

- 1. Just sharing my grief did help. Sharing my grief with others who were also dealing with their own grief, their hearts just as broken as mine, did help.
- 2. GriefShare was so much more than just talking about our losses. The sessions and workbook offered practical suggestions on taking care of yourself, breaking out of cycles of anxiety, how to work through all the emotions the anger, uncertainty, bitterness all of it. It didn't sugarcoat the pain or downplay it.
- 3. We talked about the definition of hope as confidence in the character of God as good, even in the midst of our sorrow. He can handle our big emotions, and we don't have to shy away from showing Him our pain.

I may not be "good at grief" yet, but I have better tools to help me along the way.

GraceLand Capital Campaign Update

Thank you to all who have been supporting the GraceLand Capital Campaign since it began a year ago. During June we collected around \$65,000.00, which brings the total collected for the campaign to around \$360,000.00! The more of the principal of our loan that we pay down during this period puts us in a better position to begin executing the beginning stages of the Master Plan, which was approved by congregational vote back in May.
