Child Beyond International Mission Trip

In 2017 Grace Lutheran began supporting the ministry of Child Beyond International (CBI). The mission of CBI is to rescue children. There are many children in Guatemala that suffer from neglect or abuse, and there are many others who have lost their parents and are orphaned. CBI operates a private Christian Children's Home in Guatemala, where they rescue children. Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me." When these little children arrive at the Children's Home they are often suffering the mental, physical, and spiritual effects of trauma. CBI brings these children in, shows them the love of Christ, and provides for their spiritual, physical, and mental needs. Then, after a time of healing, CBI identifies forever homes where these children can continue to be nurtured in the love of Christ. In addition to operating the Children's Home, CBI alleviates poverty in various communities in Guatemala. They build homes for families in need, install water filtration systems and efficient cook stoves, host medical clinics, and various other projects that fill a critical need.

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Every year since 2017, Grace Lutheran has supported CBI with a portion of our Christmas Mission Offering. Over the years, our partnership in the Gospel has deepened, and now a portion of our annual Engage mission budget goes to support their work. This year we are looking to further deepen that partnership in two ways: By increasing our support and becoming one of CBI's "Rescue Churches" (a church that provides \$12,000 of assistance per year) and by hosting a short-term mission trip to Guatemala.

Informational Meeting

On **Sunday, August 17th** after the 10:45 AM service, we will hold an informational meeting for anyone who is interested in going on this short-term mission trip. At the meeting, we will share more information on the ministry of Child Beyond International, the pre-trip planning process, the projects we might complete, and a timeline. The short-term mission trip will take place during spring break for most of our area schools, **March 14-21**. I am excited about how this partnership continues to grow and look forward to our church becoming more involved in mission work locally and internationally.

In reflecting on that message, I've been thinking more about the ways in which people suffer and how the Church can bring the hope of Christ to people who need to hear a word of hope.

Around the same time as we began reading Colossians I came across a local news article about First Stop. First Stop was asking for various donations, especially in this season of very warm weather. We began a white bag drive for First Stop, and this past Wednesday we dropped off what we had collected in the past weeks.

First, a huge thank you to everyone who participated in this drive. Being one of your pastors is such an honor and a blessing. It is truly amazing to see how this church steps up and helps others in need. Getting an opportunity to share what we have gathered is an amazing thing of which to be a part.

Second, the community at First Stop was overwhelmed in the best possible way with how generous we have been. Grace has supported First Stop for a number of years. We have teams of people who volunteer their time by serving a meal, and we regularly do a white bag drive at different points in the year benefiting the organization. The continued giving and caring for First Stop is something that does not go un-noticed.

I had a chance to talk with the executive director, Chad Rodriguez, and different staff members. Each one of them was blown away with how many supplies we had gathered. There are many in Huntsville who are in need, and being able to share God's Word, His comfort, and His hope is an amazing blessing. We look forward to exploring more ways to support First Stop as we care for those in our community. Keep on sharing the love of Christ and being God's witnesses.

GROW - NEW STUDY OPPORTUNITIES

The Insurmountable Problem, the Solution, and More

The purpose of this life is preparation for the next. This life is short and will end. The next life is for eternity. There are two roads to the next life. One leads to eternity in heaven. The other leads to eternity in hell – the lake of fire. Our problem is that we are born on the wrong road – and the vast majority of people stay on it. As Jesus said, "broad is the road that leads to destruction and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it." Which road are you on? Which road are your friends, family, coworkers, neighbors and others on? That gets us to a number of questions.

1) How did we get on the wrong road? 2) Can we move ourselves from the road to destruction to the road to heaven? 3) If we can't do it ourselves, is there away, and what is it? 4) What do I need to do? 5) What can I do to warn other people and show them the way? This class will address these questions and hopefully provide some answers. It will employ videos from experts as well as discussion. It will cover the most important questions you'll face in your life. Dennis Sierk will lead the class beginning on August 10th in the Cafeteria.

Cost of Discipleship

We will be focusing on Section 2, "The Sermon on the Mount" from Matthew 5 - 7. In these chapters from Matthew, Jesus teaches us what it means to follow him; in other words, to be his disciple. He challenges what we may have been taught or believe about such topics as revenge, truthfulness, money, and prayer. While we will be using Bonhoeffer's book as a backdrop and be informed by what he has to say, our focus will be on the teaching of Jesus and how it impacts our lives now. The format of the class includes a review of Jesus' teaching on a certain subject, insights by Bonhoeffer, and a chance to discuss Jesus' teaching with others in the class. Bill Baldwin will lead the class beginning on August 10th in the Assembly Room.

LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with McDonnell Elementary School (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies. You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



First Stop encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! 3-4 servers are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to **First Stop** by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM.
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.
- Lunch is served from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM.

Forgotten

Have you ever felt left out or forgotten? My guess is we have all felt that way at some point in our lives. I have memories of being the last person chosen for a team, being left off of an invitation list, having a birthday forgotten, and the pain of grief lingering when others have "moved on." All of these are significant instances of feeling forgotten.

God never forgets you. He made you! In Isaiah 49:15-16 we are reminded, "Can a woman forget her nursing child, that she should have no compassion on the son of her womb? Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you. Behold, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands; your walls are continually before me." The image of being engraved on the palms of our God is overwhelming and reassuring that when all others forget, God does not forget you, your struggles, your circumstances, and every detail of your life. He loves you so deeply.

When I was younger, I would write reminders on my hand or arm, when paper was not readily available. Those notes were temporary and could be washed away, but when you are engraved on God's hands, it's eternal.

Grief can linger and interrupt our thoughts at times. It can feel like others have moved on and forgotten our loved one. **GriefShare** is a 13 week program that uses videos and facilitated group discussions to provide a Christ-centered supportive environment through the grief jouney. Our next GriefShare group will begin on **August 10th**. Registration details can be found in the Announcements section of Grace Notes, in the bulletin, on the Grace Lutheran website, and in Pastor Russ' Sunday Worship email.

Grace offers support through GriefShare and Stephen Ministry. If you are looking for encouragement and strength during challenging circumstances in life and times of feeling forgotten, a Stephen Minister can listen and support you as you look for peace and hope in His Word. No matter the circumstances, you are NOT forgotten!

A GriefShare group is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. At this 13-week support group program, you'll discover what to expect in the days ahead and what's "normal" in grief. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, you'll learn helpful ways of coping with grief, in all its unpredictability—and gain solid support each step of the way. At each weekly meeting, you will view a video featuring respected counselors, pastors, and healthcare professionals on grief-related topics, plus you'll hear relatable personal stories of grief. After that is a small-group discussion to allow people time to talk, share support, and personally apply what they learned on the video. Everyone will receive a book to take home filled with valuable exercises for navigating their personal grieving process.
