Matching Gift - Quickly Met

Well, that was quick! Earlier this summer a Grace Lutheran couple made the generous decision to offer a matching gift for our GraceLand Capital Campaign. Every dollar given up to \$100,000 from August through December would be matched dollar for dollar. We began this matching gift opportunity in August, and had five months to complete the challenge. I am happy to report that we met the challenge in only two months! Thanks be to God.

By the end of September, your generosity met the entire match. The \$100,000 that you gave was matched by their \$100,000, and in just two months, together you paid off \$200,000 of our debt on the recently purchased property. Praise the Lord, and thank you for your generosity!

Building Expansion and Worship Space Needs

Last year, our Master Plan Committee worked with Fuqua and Partners Architects to develop a Master Site Plan for our campus. Our voters adopted that plan on May 18, 2025. We have also been making great progress in paying off the debt incurred when we purchased the property in December of 2023. The property was purchased for \$3.2 million, and in less than two years we have paid down over one-third of that debt so that our current debt is \$2,104,843.38. At the same time, our worship attendance has continued to grow.

In the July Grace Notes, I wrote about it being "High Tide in the Sanctuary." The waters are showing no signs of receding. Our average worship attendance in August and September is up 6.5% from this time last year (up from 338 to 360). Our progress in paying down the debt combined with our continued growth and need for more space demonstrates that it is time to get engineered drawings for the First Phase of the Master Plan. The First Phase would include the new Child Development Center, a covered entrance on the north side of our sanctuary, and parking on the north side of our campus. Adding parking and an entrance on the north side of our campus would allow us to hold a third worship service on Sunday mornings to address our increasing need for additional worship space. The engineered drawings will allow us to have more concrete numbers for the cost of the different projects.

As we live through this exciting season in the life of our congregation here at Grace, we keep our eyes fixed on the purpose of the LORD. God's Fingerprints are Everywhere

In last month's Grace Notes, I wrote on vocation, this beautiful expression of the faith that is prominent in Lutheran theology. It is among the great treasures that came from the Protestant Reformation. God pours out his blessings upon his people and gives various stations and ways for Christians to be the hands and feet of God.

When I was a kid, I learned a camp song called *The Hippo Song*. It is a silly song; the lyrics describe how God made all kinds of creatures, including the hippo. But one line of the song stands out to me, and it doesn't necessarily limit itself to just hippos. "God's fingerprints are everywhere, just to show how much he cares."

Our God is a hands-on God. God is hands-on through his act of creation. God is hands-on as he sends his Son Jesus into the world. God is hands-on as Jesus goes to the cross for us and his hands are nailed for us. God is hands-on through the church sharing the faith given to them and the good news of Jesus' death, resurrection, and return.

We can see God's fingerprints everywhere, and we especially see God's fingerprints at work as he sets us in the many places and stations we have in life. We are surrounded by God's fingerprints at work as he creates us to be people who worship him, grow in their faith, and who share that faith by engaging in service for their neighbor.

Peter calls the church to a life that is hands-on, just as their Lord is hands-on. "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another," he writes at the end of his letter. The faith of the church is certainly one that clings to the heart as it trusts in all of God's promises, but it doesn't stay there. The faith of the church flows out through the hands as God's people practice being God's fingerprints, as their faith touches the lives of others, as their hands reach out to engage in life with others, and as their lives serve as a witness to the hope that lives within them.

We have an opportunity to Engage in Service together, hands-on, as a church. Grace is hosting Freedom Sings USA, a non-profit organization that helps veterans tell their stories through songs. Come join us as we serve with our hands for those who have served their country with much more than their hands.

A concert of these songs will be performed live at Grace on **October 11th** at **5:30 PM**, and I invite you to join us as we Engage in Service with Freedom Sings USA. If you would like more information about Freedom Sings USA or would like to Engage hands-on, please let me know.

GROW - NEW STUDY OPPORTUNITIES

Psalms

This Bible study will take a dive into the book of Psalms. We will be using the videos and study guide from The Epic of Eden – Psalms by S. Richter as the foundation of the class information and discussion. Delaine Schiestel will lead the study in Cafeteria, beginning on October 12th.

Who wrote the Psalms and why - in the historical context
How psalms were used in worship – in the past and present
Exploring the different types of psalms and how we can use them for praise, comfort, and lamenting
Interpreting the Psalms through a lens of sacred space and Divine Authority
Jesus and the Psalms – His use of them and the Prophetic Psalms

This study will reflect first on the Case for Heaven, which is a five-week study and video presentation by noted apologist Lee Strobel. Each of us wants to know what awaits on the other side of death. Is there any convincing proof that we will live on in eternity? If so, what will our experience be like? Follow Strobel on this journey of discovery of the entirely credible, believable, and exhilarating life to come. During the remaining seven weeks we will look into a study by John Burke from his book "Imagine Heaven." What do the Scriptures say about heaven? What can we specifically learn from Jesus about Heaven? This thrilling journey into the afterlife will make you feel like you've been there, forever changing the way you view the life to come-and the way you live your life today. You'll discover Heaven is even more amazing than you've imagined. Come and join us for this exciting adventure into our future home. LOCAL MISSION ENGAGE CONNECTIONS

Grace Lutheran has developed a relationship with McDonnell Elementary School (4010 Binderton Place, Huntsville, AL 35805). We have been advocates for the school and open to responding to needs as they are shared with us. We are still stocking their Little Library with children's books. The library has been moved nearer to the school building as it was knocked down twice recently. We have a need for children's books, activity books, and basic school supplies. You can support this project by contributing gently used children's books or providing such items as commercially wrapped individual snacks (examples: Cheez-It crackers, Lance sandwich crackers, Rice Krispy or granola bars). Books and school supplies along with food supplies may be placed in the chest in the church narthex. Thanks for your generous support as you respond in the love of Jesus.



First Stop encounters the homeless where they are, connects them to critical services and support, and empowers them toward independent sustainable living. So far this year, the First Stop team has successfully assisted 53 individuals from homelessness to independent, sustainable living. These are 53 people who are no longer living on the street but are sleeping in the safety and comfort of their own homes.

First Stop relies on volunteer support to provide hot meals twice a day at the temporary facility location – 2820 Governors Drive.

Volunteer Tips for providing meals:

- Meals should serve 80-100 people. Prepare food for 80 people! 3-4 servers are needed to serve the meal.
- Provide food that is already prepared and only needs to be heated. No cooking, please.
- We serve Breakfast and Lunch, Monday through Friday. Breakfast meals are to delivered to **First Stop** by 7:45 AM and lunch meals by no later than 11:15 AM.
- Breakfast is served from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.
- Lunch is served from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM.

GraceLand Capital Campaign Update

Thank you to all who have been supporting the GraceLand Capital Campaign since it began a year ago. During August we collected around \$70,000.00. which brings the total collected for the campaign to over \$570,000.00! Combined with excess funds that were put toward debt reduction, we have paid down over \$1 million of our initial \$3.2 million loan. In August a challenge was presented to the congregation to donate \$100,000.00 through December, which would then be matched by an anonymous donor. Through the generosity of our members we reached that goal in just two months! Thank you so much for your giving spirit!

The more of the principal of our loan that we pay down during this period puts us in a better position to begin executing the beginning stages of the Master Plan, which was approved by congregational vote back in May. Click <u>here</u> to see a layout of the approved plan.
